You don't need to have any academic background - just an interest in queer ideas and stories.



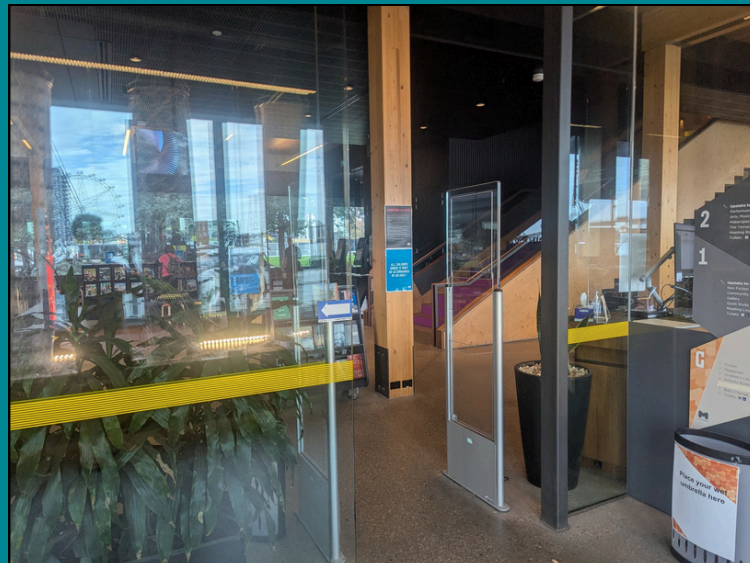

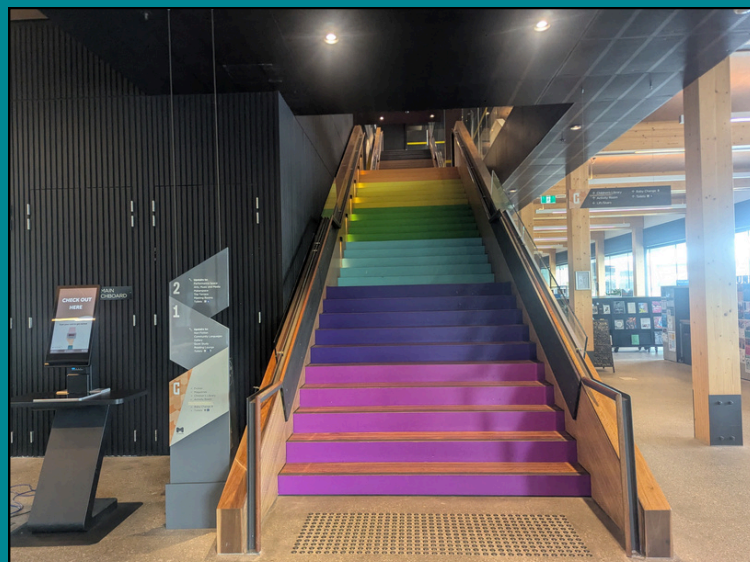

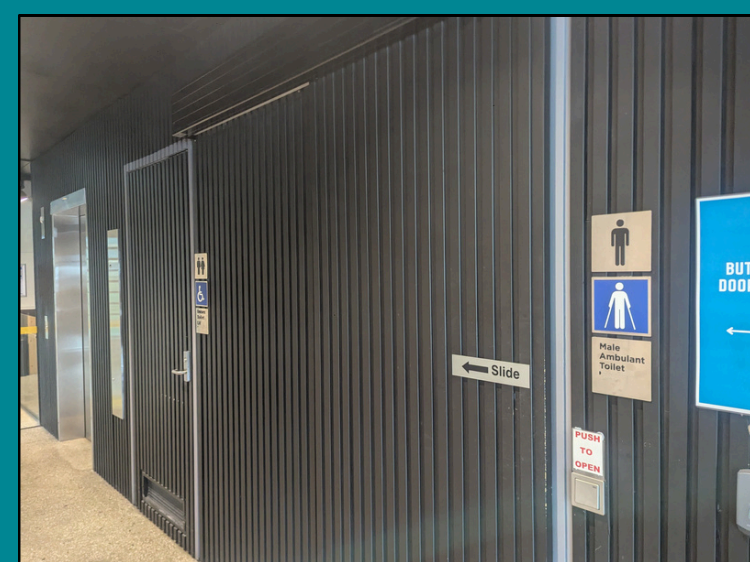
Foyer outside of the performance space.



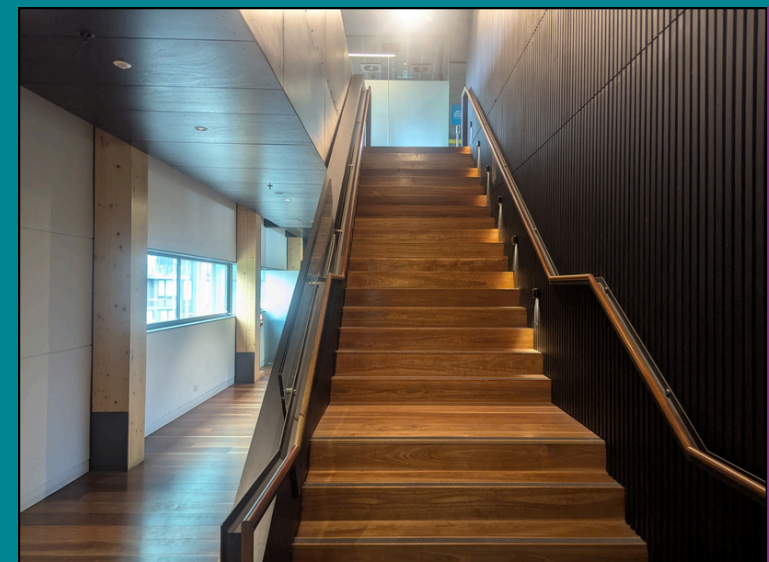
